



## 5th Megaconference Junior Joins K-12 Students Worldwide via Advanced Multi-Point Video Conferencing

Australian students will communicate and collaborate with the rest of the world via the AARNet high-capacity network

Sydney, Australia

— 21 February 2008 - Starting from 11pm AEDT on February 21 and running for 12 hours, the Australian Academic Research Network (AARNet) will be connecting Australian students to the fifth annual Megaconference Junior global virtual classroom event. The event runs from 11pm Thursday — 11am Friday, Australian Eastern Daylight Savings Time. The 12-hour duration makes it possible for schools from many time zones to participate during their regular school hours. [www.aarnet.edu.au](http://www.aarnet.edu.au). Megaconference Junior is the world's largest videoconference for school students. Thousands of K-12 students from 215 schools across 13 countries will come together using advanced videoconferencing technology to deliver presentations and activities focusing on a wide array of cultural and academic ideas.

In Australia, students and educators from Scots College in Sydney will participate in the Megaconference Junior and students from Mt Gravatt High School in Brisbane will view the event.

Chris Hancock, CEO AARNet, said, "Megaconference Junior is a project designed to give students in primary and secondary schools around the world the opportunity to communicate, collaborate and contribute to each other's learning in real time, using advanced multi-point video conferencing technology. We are pleased to be able to bring this type of global collaboration to Australian school students via AARNet's high-capacity link." Presenters for Megaconference Junior design and conduct videoconference-based presentations and activities focused on both academic and cultural issues. Participants are able to address questions to presenters and to collaborate with geographically diverse peers in collaborative learning activities, thus building international cultural awareness.

Starting at 10:05am on Friday, February 22 AEDT, students at Sydney's Scots College will be presenting a 25-minute documentary as part of Megaconference Junior. The documentary, entitled, "A Truth Acknowledged", focuses on the students' lives and their feelings on global warming. The students will be available for a Q and A session after the documentary is complete.
