flowering time according to the species but range in colour from white, pink through to red, some species are also creamy or yellow.

This ebook was written to provide inspiration and reference information to both amateur and professional gardeners, and be a valuable resource and source of information to students of horticulture to make the most of this colourful and versatile plant.
