

Two Sisters, starring Jean Kittson, at Emanuel Synagogue: tickets on sale!

Tickets on sale now! Acclaimed Producer Adam Liberman and Emanuel Synagogue are excited to present Two Sisters, starring renowned actress and comedian, Jean Kittson. The four performances of the dramatised reading will take place at Emanuel Synagogue in Woollahra between 19 and 23 May 2021.
